In the last year, Impact Global Health Alliance

expanded its life-saving impact, building on 41 years of dedicated service to mothers and children worldwide. In 2023, through collaboration, innovation, and communitydriven health programs, we've empowered 5,000+ families, improving their access to essential health services and education. Our efforts have not only saved lives but also nurtured healthier communities, marking a legacy of hope and resilience across the globe.

### GUATEMALA

In Guatemala, Indigenous communities face extreme rates of maternal and child mortality and malnutrition. We've partnered with Maya communities for over 20 years, using a local, communityled approach to improve health outcomes. Local champions educate and implement solutions in their own language and context.



In Kenya, our woman-led, local nonprofit partner has spent five years enhancing maternal and child health through community-driven efforts. We empower communities to improve their health, supported by collaboration with community groups leaders, the private sector, and government, making healthy behaviors practical and sustainable.

97% of mothers receive visits from a Community Health Volunteer to check on the health and well-being of her child and her.

95% of mothers of children under age 1 participate in twice monthly meetings with other mothers in their community.


In the most rural area where we work, we have documented an increase in handwashing stations with soap from 0% to 90% of homes.

In a pivotal shift, our Bolivian partners, CSRA, are transitioning to a private healthcare model after over 25 years of collaboration with the government. Nationwide, Bolivia has embraced CSRA and Impact Global Health Alliance's home visit approach and other CBIO strategies, such as community mapping, ensuring comprehensive health coverage. Despite political challenges, our methods keep maternal and child mortality rates low. Bolivian experts are now extending these life-saving strategies to new underserved areas en el Alto. We are excited to see what good they will do this year!

CSRA, our Bolivian partners, have been fully independent since 1995.


The Bolivian government has nationalized our model of community health, using censuses, maps and routine home visitation across the country.

Holistic care includes therapy for children with special needs and support for their families through the Rosa Vera Fund.
